

Halton Resolve

Resolve is an emotional health & wellbeing service for children, young people & families to reduce the impact of domestic abuse on individuals, families & community.

The team is made up of experienced & skilled professionals who provide an opportunity for children and young people to be believed, reassured & listened to. In all the Resolve work, the voice of the child is extremely important & central to the plan of work that takes place.

The offer

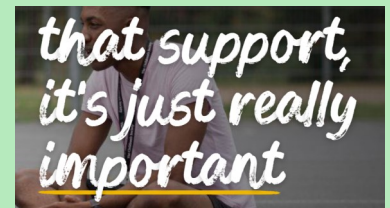
- A safe and confidential space where a young person and family feels listened to and understood.
- Up to 12 one to one sessions of individual & family intervention to reduce risks and issues specifically related to domestic abuse that take place face to face (digitally is also an option)
- Sessions include safety planning, awareness of healthy & unhealthy relationships and resilience building to help create a tool box of healthy coping strategies.
- Support to professionals with pre-court proceedings.

In the Autumn Resolve will also offer Gateway which will be 5- 7 sessions as 1:1 or as a part of group programme. Further details will come out about this.

Gateway will provide the opportunity to gain an understanding of domestic abuse with particular emphasis placed upon the cycle of control and its disempowering effects, why a person may find it difficult to leave/end an abusive relationship alongside of considering options in regards to safety planning and moving forward. Gateway also provides an opportunity to gain insight into the effects that domestic abuse has upon them as parents and also their children.

Eligibility

- Domestic Abuse must be within last 12 months
- Children and Families must be Halton residents
- Young people need to be aged 5- 19 years and up to 25 years if they have additional needs.
- Intervention must be part of an identified needs in either an Early Help/ Multi- Agency Plan (MAP) Child in Need or Child Protection Plan.



How to make a referral

- Professionals must gain consent from the child and family/carers prior to completing a referral
- The resolve team are using Eclipse so the lead professional needs to complete a **Domestic Abuse Resolve referral form**
- Within 5 working days a member of the Resolve team will triage the referral and contact will be made with the referrer and family to inform them that the referral has been accepted or not.
